Drawing inspiration from the world's traditions of puppet and mask theatre, and its lively roots in transformative ritual and street theatre, HOTB creates vital, poetic theater for all ages and backgrounds. Sled Dogging with Charlotte Wolf, Charlotte is a real find in southern Brainerd. She grew up in St. Paul, MN and had a passion for dogs and sled dogs in particular, as a young child. She volunteered at a shelter working with the dogs and eventually went to school to become a veterinarian technician. She's worked with dogs and their owners at sled dog races like the Iditarod and the John Beargrease races. FEBRUARY

David Treuer is an author who was born and raised in Minnesota. He is the younger brother of Anton, and is a professor in California. He is also Ojibwe and raised on the Leech Lake Reservation in northern Minnesota. His first book, *Little*, came out in 1995. He received his PhD in anthropology and published his second novel, *The Hiawatha*, in 1999. His third novel *The Translation of Dr Apelles* and a book of criticism, *Native American Fiction; A User's Manual* appeared in 2006. *The Translation of Dr. Apelles* was named a **Best Book of the Year** by the *Washington Post*, *Time Out*, and *City Pages*. His recent book *Rez Life* just came out January 2012 and will be available for sale. In *Rez Life*, his first full-length work of nonfiction, Treuer brings a novelist's storytelling skill and an eye for detail to a complex and subtle examination of Native American reservation life, past and present. With authoritative research and reportage, Treuer illuminates misunderstood contemporary issues of sovereignty, treaty rights, and natural-resource conservation.

William Kent Krueger, has found his niche in mystery writing and he thrills his fans with each book published. Raised in the Cascade Mountains of Oregon, Krueger briefly attended Stanford University—before being kicked out for radical activities. After that, he logged timber, worked construction, tried his hand at free-lance journalism, and eventually ended up researching child development at the University of Minnesota. He currently makes his living as a full-time author. He's been married for over 30 years to a woman who is an attorney. With his wife and two children, he makes his home in St. Paul, a city he dearly loves. Krueger writes a mystery series set in the north woods of Minnesota. His protagonist is Cork O'Connor, the former sheriff of Tamarack County and a man of mixed heritage—part Irish and part Ojibwe. His work has received a number of awards including the Minnesota Book Award, the Loft-McKnight Fiction Award, the Anthony Award, the Barry Award, and the Friends of American Writers Prize.

Vermilion Drift, was a *New York Times* bestseller, and the eleventh book in the series, *Northwest Angle*, was released on August 30, 2011.

MARCH

Jess Lourey, Minnesota mystery author from St. Cloud will be here this March. She is a delight and is sure to entertain. One of two workshops will be presented free of charge, either *Minnesota Mystery Writing* or *Writing and Publishing*. Lourey is the author of the Lefty-nominated Murder-by-Month mysteries set in Battle Lake, Minnesota, and featuring amateur sleuth, Mira James. Her most recent book, *November Fest*, was released last summer. Lourey has been teaching writing and sociology at the college level since 1998. She spent her formative years in Paynesville, Minnesota, a small town not unlike the Murder-by-Month series' Battle Lake. Lourey currently lives in St. Cloud, Minnesota, where she teaches writing and sociology full time at the local college.

MN History Players: Virginia Mae Hope played by Melissa Friedmann, takes a step back in time. Virginia was a pilot and was a member of the Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP). Her life was short but exciting. Learn what it was like growing up on a farm in Winnebago, Minnesota during the Great Depression and serving as a female pilot during World War II. There will also be information about the bombing of Pearl Harbor and its national impact, and the changing roles of women during World War II. The WASP performed wartime duties in the United States, thus freeing male pilots for combat. Hope was one of only 1,074 women to receive the WASP "silver wings" after completing rigorous training at Avenger Field in Sweetwater, Texas. After graduation, she was assigned to the Weather Wing and stationed at Patterson Field in Dayton, Ohio. Hope was known to say, "Isn't it just wonderful!" about her WASP career, though she and other female pilots faced blatant discrimination simply because they were women.

MAY

Catherine Friend, Legacy Program author, will tour the Kitchigami Region May 8-12. A former ‘city girl,’ Friend lives on a small farm in southeastern Minnesota. As an author of children’s books she draws on her farm life for her story book characters. She will present a short children’s program reading from her books and an adult program will follow. She also writes adult nonfiction and fiction, books. *The Compassionate Carnivore* won the Minnesota Book Award in General Nonfiction. Her memoir, *Hit by a Farm*, was selected by the *Minneapolis Star Tribune* as one of the best books of 2006. Her children’s picture book, *The Perfect Nest*, was chosen by the *Wall Street Journal* as one of five best ‘read alouds,’ and was nominated for numerous state reading awards. She was awarded a Loft/McKnight Artist Fellowship for Writers, and her adult adventure novels have won awards from the Golden Crown Literary Society and the Independent Book Publishers Association.

The Okee Dokee Brothers: After years of touring the Midwest with their bluegrass band, childhood best friends Joe Mailander and Justin Lansing, originally of Denver, Colorado, decided to return to where it all began: childhood imagination. That's when they moved to Minneapolis to start their family music band called The Okee Dokee Brothers. The Okee Dokee Brothers have a mission to remind children – and adults – of their intrinsic ability to discover, imagine, and create through music. By appealing to the musical needs of the entire family and recognizing that kids deserve quality music, they are working full-time to regain the integrity of the children's music genre. They believe that music should be an energetic, interactive, and fun experience where kids can enjoy dancing, singing, and playing instruments with their families.

Dr. Anton Treuer (pronounced troy-er) is Professor of Ojibwe at Bemidji State University. He is author of eight books, including: *The Assassination of Hole in the Day* and *Ojibwe in Minnesota*, recently named "Minnesota's Best Read for 2010" by The Center for the Book in the Library of Congress. Dr. Treuer received prestigious awards and fellowships from many organizations, including the American Philosophical Society, the MacArthur Foundation, the Bush Foundation, and the John Simon Guggenheim Foundation. Professor of Ojibwe at Bemidji State University, he has a B.A. from Princeton University, M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of Minnesota. He is Editor of the *Oshkaabewis* (pronounced o-shkaah-baywis) *Native Journal*, the only academic journal of the Ojibwe language. He recently released his children's book *Awesiinyensag*, and is coming out with *Everything you Wanted to Know about Indians but were afraid to ask*.
