What is an eAudiobook?

An eAudiobook is an electronic version of a spoken word book, like books on tape or cd. Audiobooks are digitized to make them available in electronic form. These books are then listened to through a computer or downloaded to a portable listening device such as an mp3 player or iPod for listening.

What kinds of listening device do I need?

Some eAudiobooks can be listened to on any mp3 player except an Apple iPod. A growing number of titles can also be played on an iPod or iPhone.

What books and materials are available in eAudiobook format?

There are thousands of fiction and non-fiction titles, for adults and children, now available in eAudiobook format.

Where can I get eAudiobooks?

KRLS has a collection of 3,000+ eAudiobooks that is growing by more than 30 titles each month. You will find them in our catalog when you do a basic title search or keyword search for “downloadable audio.” More than 1,600 of these titles can be played on an iPod. You can also search the OneClickdigital link from our website.

eAudiobooks for individual purchase can be found through many online, web-based sites – just use the search term “eAudiobooks.”

What is an eBook?

An eBook is an electronic version of a printed book. Books are digitized by scanning or using other software to make the book available in electronic form. These books are then viewed on a computer or downloaded to a device most popularly known as an eBook reader. Some eBooks can be read using any computer or eBook reader, but some need specific devices to download and view the content. Some eBooks require an online link to view the content.

What kinds of eBook readers are available?

EBooks can be used with eBook readers, computers, or smart phone devices. The most popular eBook readers are the Barnes & Noble Nook, the Sony Reader, the Toshiba Libretto, the Lenovo Idea-Pad, and the Samsung Galaxy Pad. The Amazon Kindle is also popular, but please note it requires eBooks in a proprietary format that is not freely available.

What books and materials are available for eBook readers?

Most new, popular materials are available for purchase, including books and magazines. Books and magazines no longer under copyright, typically those published prior to 1923 and in the public domain, are being digitized and made available at no cost by a number of services.

Where can I get books for my eBook reader or computer?

EBooks for individual purchase can be found through online, web-based sites like amazon.com or barnesandnoble.com.
